

Study Window for November 2024

Looking out my study window I am thinking about giving.

I come to this month thinking about Pilgrims, Native Americans, and turkeys. And if I am honest, also dressing, mashed potatoes, gravy—beef not turkey—and pie. Lots of pie—and whipped cream. In November, I am also looking forward to two special worship services that fall this month. Fall Vespers (Sunday, November 3rd, 6:00 pm) is always a wonderful experience where we come together in the shelter house to reconnect with the wonder of Creation. I also get so much from our Thanksgiving Service (Tuesday, November 26, 6:00 pm). November is always a time to give special attention to the spiritual discipline of giving thanks. Of course, this includes when the board is spread on Thanksgiving Day.

But while I could easily let my thoughts lazily turn to those things just mentioned, something keeps bringing me back to meditating about how I use my financial resources. Too often folks in the church, both clergy and laity, talk about giving with a focus on the financial needs of a particular part of the Universal Church. It might be the local organization, the denomination, mission projects, or other ministries. And there is no denying that no matter how successful we might be at being good stewards of these outposts of God's work, they almost always require some level of financial support. We have been fortunate at St. Paul's during my time as your pastor. Giving has been steady. While it has not grown at a rate to perfectly keep up with inflation, it would be misleading to say that there is any immediate crisis building. Thanks be to God!

No, the tug I am feeling is to point out to all of us how the way we spend our resources, whether they be great or modest, defines us--and has the fortunate potential to transform us.

Jesus says this in the Sermon on the Mount (Matt. 6:19-21): "Do not lay up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy and where thieves break in and steal, but lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust destroys and where thieves do not break in and steal. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also."

I sometimes hear comments that run something like these. "I will give when the church really needs the money." "There is plenty of money in the account, the church does not need mine." "Others are not doing their part." "We have to be careful about how we talk about the money we have saved for special purposes, or it might discourage contributions to the general offering." In the ways of the world, these ideas might be understandable. But in the ways of God, they most definitely are not.

We are called to be faithful stewards of what God has given us. And how we use what we have defines our priorities. It says who we are. And not one part of this has anything to do with the level of current need, or lack thereof, of the ministries we have been called to support. (Those who are charged with balancing our budgets may wish I had not pointed this out. Sorry. But it is right there in Jesus' own words.)

We are to prepare ourselves to live in the age to come. We do this in so many ways. But sometimes we feel like certain areas of our lives are "off limits." In truth, there are no such areas. Yet we continue to fool ourselves into thinking some are. Money is one of those. We do not like anyone to talk to us about how to spend our money. I have the same feelings myself. But Jesus chose to speak directly to us about it. And we ignore that at our peril.

Of course, not everyone has the same resources available to them. No one is called to do more than they can. Granted the story of the Widow's Mite is a compelling example of someone being "all in" for God. But Deuteronomy 16:17 teaches: *All shall give as they are able, according to the blessing of the Lord your God that he has given you. See,* God calls us to prayerfully consider what we can give. But I think we are sometimes afraid to pray about this for fear of the possible answer.

Giving thanks keeps us in a proper orientation and relationship to God. Giving of the resources we have under our stewardship is a deep, counter-worldly way to give substance to our faith.

Let me close with this. I loved these words we sang at St. Paul's when I was a child. Maybe you remember them too.

We give thee but thine own, whate'er the gift may be; all that we have is thine alone, a trust, O Lord, from thee.

May the blessings of this season of thankfulness and giving be yours.
